
Please read the Jack And The Beanstalk PowerPoint to your child before completing these activities. This can be found on the school website below this pack.

Discuss the story together

• Talk together about what happened in the story

Here are some questions to ask your child:

- Did you enjoy the story?
- What was your favourite part?
- How do you think Jack was feeling when he saw the giant?
- How was Jack's mum feeling when Jack brought home the magic beans?
- Would you have climbed up the beanstalk?
- Can you think of other words to describe Jack and the giant?
- If you had some magic beans what would you like them to turn into?




Now read these words together and talk about what they mean








- Can you retell the story or act it out? You could make some stick puppets (if you have a printer Twinkl have some that you can print).

- Can you build your own castle using construction toys or boxes you have at home?






• Can you make your own beanstalk using

- Can you write a list of things that Jack/you might buy with the money?
- Can you find out about the life cycle of a bean? twinkl have a time lapse video you can watch.
- Write (or ask your grown up to write for you) a speech bubble for the different characters in the story

Problem solving - Shape, space and measures

- The beanstalk grew very tall! Can you find 3 things in your house that are taller than you?
- Can you find 3 things that are smaller than you?
- How tall are you?
- Who is the tallest in your house?
- Who is the smallest?
- Who has the biggest feet? Can you find a way to measure this?
- Have a look at different coins with your grown up. Can you find a golden coin? How much is it worth? Find out what you could buy with it?

Can you solve these number problems?




- If the old man had 5 magic beans and he gave Jack 3 of them, how many would be left?
