

voices for the different characters?







- Can you draw a picture of either the troll from the story, or design your own troll?



This week your challenge is to be able to say the number that is one less than a given number.

1 less



Use your fingers, some objects or the number line above to learn about 1 less. To find one less we have to take away which also means we have to go back down the number line.

Can you practise counting backwards from 10?

1 less than a number is simply the number that comes before the number said. One less than 5 is 4 - it is the number that came immediately before the number you have said. You are getting rid of one thing, you will have 1 less item. So if you had 4 apples and you ate 1 you would have 1 less which would mean you have 3 left .




Some activities for 1 less



- Roll a dice, what number have you rolled? Now say the number that is one less than this number. (You could ask a grown-up to help you write the number).
- Have a pretend picnic. Each have a given number of objects.
 Take 1 away how many objects have you now got left?
- Make your own number line using chalks have your grown up tell you which number to start on then find one less by jumping back one.
- Build a tower with a given number of blocks now build a tower with one less block than the first.

 Can you sing some songs that count backwards such as; 5 little speckled frogs, 5 little men in a flying saucer, 5 currant buns, 10 little monkeys jumping on the bed.






Can you solve these problems?


- Can you find out what is 1 less than 12?

- Can you have a go at one or both of the sheets on the next slides with some help from your grown-up?





- Thinking about how else the goats could cross the river, can you make a raft/boat that can float? Test it in the bath/water tray/paddling pool (with a grown-up of course).








Number Bridge
